Public Health a Priority

Did you know Unity House is host to *Project Safe Point*? It's a mobile van offering various services and support for drug users seeking treatment. Among Project Safe Point's discreet services are screening and testing for HIV and Hepatitis C, opioid overdose prevention and response training including naloxone distribution, recovery readiness counseling, treatment referral, access to syringes and prevention materials and disposal sites for safe collection of used needles and syringes.

Given the public health crisis that opiate addiction has brought to many communities, along with higher incidence of infections like HIV and Hepatitis C, programs like Project Safe Point are an important part of any public health program that works to treat addiction and prevent the spread of disease.

The MSKP focuses on providing meals for people in need at area soup kitchens. They prepare, cook and serve delicious meals once a month and on holidays. They have hosted bake sales to fund their meals, published a cook book of amazing recipes and coordinated the donation of a freezer for Unity House's Community Meals kitchen. The freezer is specially designated to preserve Halal meat for use in meals and was provided with the help of the Kazat Foundation.
